Beth Barrie is the Program Manager for the Don't Trash Nevada Program and an Assistant Research Professor for the Recreation Department of Recreation and Sport Management. Beth comes to the Public Lands Institute from The Eppley Institute at Indiana University, where she was an instructional designer for the National Park Service Interpretive Development Program curriculum revision project. Her work on that project earned her the Crystal Owl Award, the highest honor the National Park Service bestows to training and development professionals. Beth holds a B.A. in Communication, an M.S. in Outdoor Recreation and Resource Management, and a Ph.D. in Leisure Behavior.
